We are encouraging all our patients to sign up for this. It enables you to **view**, **book and cancel appointments online.**

Bring in a form of photographic ID to reception and they will give you a code to enable you to access the site to do this.

Through this site you are also able to view, request and check the progress of requested prescriptions online. You can also view your medication and allergies.

If you have a smart phone, the Patient Access app is free on the App Store and Google Play.

Last call for a flu jab

It's not too late and it is important. Please book in if you are eligible and want a flu jab.

64% of our over 65's have now been vaccinated. Any more interested?

We're particularly keen on vaccinating those in the age range of 16-64 who are eligible to have their flu jab by being in an "at risk" category.

If you are not interested or have had it done elsewhere, let us know so we can update your records.

If you are unsure if you are eligible, please ask.

Do you have a child aged, 2, 3 or 4? They are also eligible for the nasal flu spray vaccination. Book in with a nurse.

What the duty doctor is for

If you are unable to get an appointment "on the day" and your problem is urgent then your details will be taken and you will be called back by the Duty Doctor that day. If the Duty Doctor feels that you need to be seen, you will be seen that day.

Ongoing issues are best dealt with by your **usual** doctor, particularly test results which require clinical interpretation which the requesting doctor is best able to explain.

It is also not appropriate to call the duty doctor because you have run out of medication: please sign up for electronic prescribing, which enables you to request medication more conveniently.
